- 11 established, and the above items were presented to the GSSB for approval.
- Claire Dugan, Senior Manager Standards, presented the proposed member substitution for the 12
- 13 Insurance TC, listed as Item 03, for GSSB approval.

Session 2: GRI Topic Standard 14

Project for Pollution - Approval of

- Thamar Zijlstra, Senior Manager Standards, presented the final project proposal for GSSB approval. 17
- The following are questions and comments from the GSSB to the SD regarding the project proposal: 18
- 19 What was the feedback from the Stakeholder Council or Supervisory Board?
- Feedback received regarded the nomination process for including a labor candidate in the working 20
- 21 group.

- How will the project align with the Biodiversity Topic Standard? 22
- 23 The recently published GRI 101: Biodiversity lists pollution as a driver that can impact biodiversity.
- 24 During its development, the pollution project will determine how it aligns with this and other Topic
- 25 Standards.
- 26 How will soil pollution and underground water pollution be differentiated?
- 27 Pollution affects underground water sources via the soil and water. Scoping will consider how and
- 28 where soil pollution interacts with underground water and its implications on water quality.



29	Why is plastic pollution considered as part of a critical incident?
30	Plastic pollution often arises from the improper disposal of packaging and products. This project
31	proposal anticipates the development of a new Topic Standard project focused on the circular
32	economy, including the revision of GRI 301 Materials 2016 and GRI 306 Waste 2020, which can
33	address plastic pollution comprehensively. The role of plastic is still being considered within the
34	scoping process of the pollution project.
35	What is the rationale for excluding pollution linked to the circular economy from the project
36	scope?
37	Plastic pollution is significant due to its widespread impact and will be addressed in a dedicated
38	project focusing on the circular economy. This project is distinct, as outlined in the GSSB Work
39	Program, but it will be designed to complement the pollution project.

40 How does critical incident management relate to the OHS Topic Standard?

- 41 Critical incidents can affect workers, other people, and the environment. The Sector Standards for oil
- 42 and gas, coal, and mining have likely material topics on critical incident management and OHS. The
- 43 project proposal follows the recommendation by the Sector Program to develop critical incident
- 44 management further.

45 How does critical incident management relate to emergency preparedness and response?

- 46 This question was raised in the meeting chat but was not addressed; however, it will be considered in
- 47 the following context. Disclosure GRI 306-3 Significant spills is a single disclosure in GRI 306
- 48 Effluents and Waste 2016. In 2018, a new GRI Topic Standard was proposed to report spills and
- 49 leaks and their impacts, after which GRI 306 would be withdrawn. The Sector Program proposed
- 50 broadening the scope to critical incident management, including emergency preparedness and
- response plans for managing hazardous substances. GRI 403 OHS 2018 will not be part of the
- 52 current project but will be considered for compatibility when drafting new disclosures; if relevant,
- 53 organizations can report on this.

Is the wording for the theme 'emissions to air, soil, and water' correct, or should it be pollution

- 55 to air, soil, and water?
- The project proposal speaks of emissions and not pollutants, as it is a more neutral term.

57 Has the project considered using the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) as

- 58 a reference?
- 59 IUCN is a relevant source that was used to develop the Biodiversity Standard and can be considered
- 60 for this project.

61 Could microplastics be mentioned as a part of chemical management, while bigger plastics are

- 62 of pollution or waste management?
- 63 This question was raised in the meeting chat but was not addressed; however, it will be considered.



- What is the expected frequency of updates for this project, and will the GSSB receive input 64
- 65 from the technical committee?
- 66 Regarding the next steps, the Chief of Standards proposed recording an action to provide an update
- on the ongoing scoping exercise based on the approved project proposal. An update will be submitted 67
- 68 to the GSSB before publicly advertising the project and recruiting experts for the technical committee.
- Additionally, GSSB members are cordially invited to become a project sponsor. 69
